#### **Report Highlights**

Sahil has compiled its signature publication 'Cruel Numbers 2023' by monitoring 81 national and regional newspapers daily.

The objectives of this report are:

•To present the data on the situation regarding violence against children *(up to 18 years)*.

•To contribute to existing information on CSA in Pakistan.

•To contribute towards spreading awareness and information about different forms of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA) to all segments of society.

In the year 2023, a total number of **4213** child abuse cases have been reported in newspapers. These cases were reported from all four provinces including Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT), Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK), and Gilgit Baltistan (GB).

The total of 4213 cases includes reported cases of child sexual abuse (CSA), cases of abduction, cases of missing children, and cases of child marriages.

The data shows that 11 children have been abused per day during the year 2023. Gender divide analysis shows that out of the total reported cases of child abuse, 2251 (53%) of victims were girls and 1962 (47%) were boys.

The reported age shows that children are most vulnerable to abuse in the age group of 6-15 years, in which more boys than girls' victims were reported. Moreover, children as young as 0-5 years are also sexually abused.

The abuser's category of Cruel Numbers 2023 indicates that acquaintances are still the most involved in child sexual abuse, along with Relative, family members, strangers and women abettors.

The geographical divide statistics shows that out of the total 4213 reported cases, 75% were reported from Punjab, 13% cases from Sindh, 7% cases from Islamabad capital territory, 3% cases from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), and 2% cases from Baluchistan, Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK), and Gilgit Baltistan (GB).

**Cruel Number 2023** 

These reported cases, 91% of cases were registered with the police which that is positive sign of an active police.

The cases of only CSA were 2021, with both genders equally victimized.

A total number of 61 cases reported murder after sexual abuse.

A total number of 1833 cases were reported of abduction

A total number of 330 cases of missing children were reported.

In cases of child marriages, 29 cases were reported with 27 cases of girls, and 2 cases of boy.

In this year, Sahil also monitored cases of children up to 18 years, who had suffered some kind of injury or death.

Out of a total of 2184 cases monitored, highest numbers were of children were 694 drowned 401, died in accidents 286, murdered 121 tortured, 111 injured

110 committed suicide and died from 103 electric shocks.

These shocking results need attention.

#### **Data Collection**

Sahil every year collects the data on cases of child sexual abuse (CSA), primarily from newspapers reports and cases reported directly to Sahil. This year Sahil monitored 81 national and regional newspapers. These are Urdu, English, and 7 Sindhi newspapers from the provinces, Sahil head office and regional offices.

Cases once recorded and submitted by the regional offices are cross-checked to avoid duplication, as the same child sexual abuse case might be reported in different newspapers. Cases received from other sources are also scrutinized strictly to avoid repetition.

All recorded cases are of victims of child sexual abuse, abduction, and child marriages of children below 18 years of age. This age limit is chosen in accordance with the age defined for a child by the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

A comprehensive format is used for the data collection which records gender, age of the victim, abuser's categories, place of abuse, period of abuse, and identification of the geographical areas with urban-rural divide and status of the case registered with the police.


All the information is recorded directly from newspaper clippings. The police stations are contacted to enable sahil legal officers to send free legal aid offer letters to the victims.

# **Findings of Cruel Numbers 2023**

#### **Comparison of Total Cases**

The data of child abuse shows that a total number of 4213 cases have been reported during the year 2023. This data includes cases of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA), Abduction, Missing Children, and Child Marriages.

For this year a decrease of 40 cases is seen as compared to last year 2022.




The data shows that more than 11 children have been abused per day during the year 2023.

These cases were reported from 81 national, regional and local newspapers from all across the country including Azad Jamu Kashmir (AJK) and Gilgit Baltistan (GB).

#### **Gender Divide**


The gender divide shows that both girls and boys are vulnerable to abuse.



Out of the total 4213 child abuse, cases (47%) were boys and (53%) were girls. In the category of gender, the same trend of girls and boys is seen as was recorded in the previous years despite a decreased number of total cases.

#### Age of Victims

The data shows that children of all ages can be victims of sexual abuse. Sexual abuse generally occurs due to lack of awareness among children and parents.



The analysis shows that this year, similar to last year, the age bracket from 6 to 15 years were more vulnerable. Out of the total cases 48% were reported in these age brackets.


The graph shows that the highest number of victims are in the age bracket of 11-15 years.

It is alarming that children from the age bracket 0-5 years are also abused.

# **Crime Category**


The graph shows child abuse cases categorized in detail into different sub-categories



In the year 2023, the analysis of the data indicates that out of a total of 4213 child abuse cases, 2021 were of sexual abuse, 1833 were abduction, 330 missing children, and 29 cases were reported of child marriages.

# **Abduction, Child Sexual Abuse and Pornography Definition of Pornography (Section 292-B. in Pakistan Penal Code)**

"Pornography can be understood as the explicit representation of sexual activities in videos, images, writing and visual films. Made or produced by electronic, mechanical, or other means, of obscene or sexually explicit conduct....."



In the year 2023, out of the total reported cases, a total of 95 cases were reported of abduction, along with child sexual abuse and pornography. This year number of cases child pornography has decreased from 109 cases to 95 cases as compared to last year.



### Abuser Identification

#### **Definitions of Abuser Categories**

**Abuser:** *"An abuser can be anyone from a close blood relative to a stranger".* The graph details the list of abusers who are involved in abusing children in the year 2023.

As in previous years the abuser category of acquaintances continues to be the most reported abuser, with a total of 1787.




Other abusers are 876 strangers, 103 neighbors, 69 relatives, 51 religious teachers and 29 school teachers were involved in child sexual abuse cases. These abusers are identified in the reports.

#### **Places of Abuse**

*"Places of abuse are defined as the vicinity where children were exploited."* The analysis of the data shows that out of the total 4213 reported cases, 71% of incidents occurred in closed places and 29 % cases were occurred in open places. **Closed Places:** *"Closed places are those that are a room or in an enclosure."* The below graph reveals that, 20% cases of abuse occurred at the abusers place, showing the power of perpetrators, 17% cases at the victims place, 2% cases at the place of worship mosques and madrassahs.

The data shows that children are not safe at any place which are considered secure by our society such as homes and educational institutes.







The above graph shows that out of total reported cases at open places, 85% cases took place in streets, 11% cases in the fields, 3% cases occurred in jungle.

#### **Period of Abuse**

"Period of abuse shows the duration of the crime committed against the victim."


Statistics of the cruel numbers shows that in 84% cases, the victims were abused once.

In 12% cases the period of abuse was not mentioned. The recording of the period of abuse is important because it shows that the abuser may go without detection due to his power over the victims.


#### **Geographical Area of Crime**

Out of the 4213 cases, 75% were reported from Punjab, 13% cases from Sindh, 7% cases from Islamabad capital territory, 3% cases from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), and 2% cases from Baluchistan, Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK), and Gilgit Baltistan (GB).




#### **Rural-Urban Divide**

The graph shows that out of the total 4213 reported cases, 2134 (51%) cases are reported from rural areas and 2079 (49%) cases were reported from urban areas.



#### **Case Registration Status**

The purpose of recording the case registration status is to see if victims are able to access the police station to submit applications and receive a positive response through the registration of the FIR (First Information Report).



The above graph shows that, out of the total 4213 reported cases 91% of cases were registered with the police that is positive sign of an active police.

Police refusal is usually due to their experience of children showing up after a few days having gone to friend or relatives house without informing the family.

#### **Districts-wise Distribution of Data**

This table indicates, that in this year of 2023, a total of 93 districts were identified from all provinces including ICT, AJK, and GB.

#### **Ten Most Vulnerable Districts**

This table illustrates the top ten most vulnerable districts for child abuse cases.

In the year 2023, out of the total number of 4213 reported cases more than half 69% of cases were reported from these 10 districts outof these 10 districts,8 districts from Punjab, 1 from Sindh, and Islamabad Capital Territory.

Unlike the previous year, Faisalabad is on the top with 888 cases.



# Analysis of Child Sexual Abuse Cases Only

This section provides a detailed analysis of all child sexual abuse cases only, excluding cases of abduction, missing children, and cases of early marriages.

#### Data of Only CSA

This year out of the total number of 4213 reported cases, a total of 2021 (48%) cases of only CSA were reported.



The statistics of the report show that in the year 2023, 102 cases of only CSA were less than last year's data.

#### **Gender Divide**


Every year, millions of girls and boys around the world face sexual abuse and exploitation.

The general perception is that girls are more vulnerable to child sexual abuse. However, Sahil Cruel Numbers shows that more boys than girls were victimized.

#### Age of Victims of Only CSA Cases

The graph of the age of victims shows that children in all age groups are the victims of CSA.



The analysis in the age brackets shows that the age group of 6-15 years as the most vulnerable to sexual abuse. Like the previous years in the age bracket 6-15 more boys than girls were subject to sexual abuse.

#### Analysis of Age Group 0-5 Years Age Group 0-5 Years

The data shows that children from the age bracket 0-5 Years are victims of sexual abuse.

The common perception is that newborn and infants are safe because everybody loves and takes care of them, but unfortunately this is not true.
















































# **Case Comparison of Missing Children**


# Gender Divide of Missing Children







In the year 2023, a total of 29 cases of child marriages were reported. In comparison to the previous year's data child marriages cases have decreased.


# **Gender Divide of Child Marriages**





# RECOMMENDATION

1. Article 25-A of the Constitution of Pakistan on free education for 5 years olds to 16 years must be implemented to ensure children are in schools.

2. Mental Health Professionals must be available in schools for senior students.

3. Awareness raising programs must be given to all stakeholders, especially teachers, parents and children, regarding safety measures to protect children from all forms of harm .

4. Child Friendly police stations and courts must be established to ease victim case registration and evidence.

5. Juvenile courts must be in place as recommended in JJSO.

6. Implementation of Islamabad High Court Order 2019, stating that the rank of not less than an assistant superintendent police officer(ASP) will investigate cases of child sexual abuse.

7. Law against Child Domestic Labour must be legislated.







The reason behind these cases is the negligence of society. As a whole there is the need of immediate attention for preventive measures.







However, we would like to quote the survey report of an NGO from Islamabad, published in Daily Dawn dated13th of Feb, 2000which has not been changed by the Government. As per the said report about one thousand children were abused in the year,1999. The afore-referred report is being reproduced below. Islamabad,Feb,12A spokesperson for Sahil, an NGO working against child abuse ,told a press conference here on Friday that during 1999 as many as945 children were sexually abused by 1,629 men. Sahil put out these figures by monitoring media for cases of child sexual abuse. The NGO monitors 11 Urdu and English Newspapers regularly. **The spokesperson for Sahil said that out of 945 reported cases, 56 percent pertained to girls and44 percent to boys.** He said that these 945 cases were just the tip of the iceberg. Sahil maintains that the majority of the cases go unreported due to social tendencies of

denial and silence According to the statistics of the Sahil, out of 1,629 abusers, 1219 were acquaintances. About murder after sexual assault, the NGO said 15 girls were gang-raped and 15 boys were murdered. It said that 169 girls were gang-raped and 117 male children were sodomized. Sahil's data shows that 21 cases of incest were reported during Jan-Dec 1999. This is a confirmation for those who deny that incest occurs in Pakistan. According to Sahil's figures during this period, the abusers have targeted a majority of boys between the ages of 5-10 years and 10-15 years.

It is the duty of the state through its executive functionaries to ensure that the rights of children are not only safeguarded but persons who harm them are prosecuted in a manner that there is no likelihood of avoiding exemplary punishment. Crimes against children cannot be left to be dealt with by incompetent, unwilling and unprofessional investigators. Keeping in view the nature of offense of child sexual abuse and the state of affairs relating to the quality of investigations in Islamabad capital territory, it is directed that in a case involving alleged sexual abuse of a child, the investigations will be promptly entrusted to an official who is not lower in rank than an Assistant superintendent of police.in the present case the investigations are directed to be conducted by a senior officer. The Inspector General and Chief Commissioner, Islamabad capital Territory may also consider developing a mechanism for an examination of persons accused of sexual abuse or sexual molestation by a Medical Board to assess likely risk of repeating the offense if released on bail in addition to conducting a search regarding their past criminal history.
